## 2012 Middlemarkers Competition

### For the Rabbetts Family Trophy

This club competition is open to riders who have **not** beaten 25 minutes for a Ten mile Time Trial or 1 hour 5 minutes for a 25 mile Time Trial in the previous three seasons. The competition will be decided on the same points scoring system as the Classic League, with the following exception, in the non-club events only Wanderers are counted - i.e. if you finish 53<sup>rd</sup> in the Sussex CA 25, but you were the only LWCC rider in the event, you would score 30 points. Is that clear? If not please ask.

This year's competition is based on the following Ten events

- 1) 04/03 - Circuit of Laughton - 12.46 miles
- 2) 18/03 - ESCA Hardriders - 15.6 miles
- 3) 15/04 - Circuit of Danehill - 18.11 miles
- 4) 21/04 - ESCA 10 miles
- 5) 22/04 - ESCA & Club 25 miles
- 6) 06/05 - Sussex CA 25 miles
- 7) 28/06 - Circuit of Earwig 17.68 miles
- 8) 15/09 - ESCA 10 miles
- 9) 16/09 - ESCA 25 miles
- 10) 30/09 - Circuit of Chailey 17.58 miles

The Middlemarkers is entering its seventh season. Alan Lloyd won the first two, with Johan Stegers winning in 08, Tom Baker in 09, Stephen Gaston in 10 and Micky Turner taking the trophy last year. All the previous winners are ineligible for 2012, as they have improved beyond the qualification criteria. This means a new champion will be crowned for 2012. It could be you?

### Entering Club Time Trials

The Evening Ten Series; Ten 2-up & the Club Hill Climb are entered on the line - i.e. turn up, sign on, pay £3, ride.

Completed CTT (Cycling Time Trials) entry forms (available as download from the club website) are required for the four Club Circuit (Laughton, Danehill, Earwig & Chailey) events. Please also include the £3.00 entry fee (Cheques payable to LWCC). Entries must be completed fully & correctly and be with our Time Secretary at least 12 days before the event. Send to:

We rely on volunteers to run our racing programme. So if you ride a time trial this year, can you please try and give some time/commitment to help on at least one of our events.

## 2012 Classic League Competition

The Classic League Shield is awarded on a points basis to the club member who has the best placings in a number of selected time trials on 'sporting' / 'hilly' courses.

Points are scored for finishing in the top 30 in each event i.e. a 1<sup>st</sup> place is worth 30 points; 2<sup>nd</sup> place is worth 29 points down to 1 point for 30<sup>th</sup>. Riders finishing outside the top 30 do not get any points.

This year's competition is based on the following Ten events

- 2) 25/03 - Southern Counties CU (Hilly) - 25 miles
- 3) 31/03 - Tooting BC (Sporting) - 21 miles
- 4) 09/04 - Brighton Mitre (Hilly) - 25 miles
- 5) 22/04 - ESCA & Club - 25 miles
- 6) 06/05 - Sussex CA - 25 miles
- 7) 03/06 - Crawley Wheelers - 41.9 miles
- 8) 01/07 - LWCC Open - 30 miles
- 9) 15/07 - ESCA & Club - 50 miles
- 10) 16/09 - ESCA - 25 miles

The Classic League Shield was first presented in 1985 by Sylvia Burgess and has over the years been won by many of the fastest Wanderers. Peter Morris won it in 2011.

## Points Competition

### For the Mick Burgess Memorial Trophy

It's about riding all (or as many as you can) of the pure club TTs (not open events that feature club championships, like the ESCA 25, 50 etc). The first rider will score 100 points, second 99 etc. This level of points means that the rider(s) who complete the most events should come out on top.

Peter Baker won the inaugural event and repeated his victory in 2010. Matt Coombs won it in 2011 when we had a total of 82 different club members scoring points. For more info on 2011 see No. 252 our November 2011 magazine.

**BAR Competitions:** Along with the above challenges, we run various Best All Rounder (BAR) competitions for Senior, Veteran, Female & Junior riders.
